The Redwood's Safety Assessment + Risk Management (SARM) Training

- Course 1: SARM's fundamental principles, procedures, guidelines, and how SARM was informed from various bodies of research, including cases reviewed by the Ontario Domestic Violence Death Review Committee.
- Course 2: SARM's requirements of a crisis call. The standard practice and application of SARM tools, including the Crisis Call Safety Checklist, Emergency Escape Plan, Fast Form and Essential(s) to Take When Leaving Form.
- Course 3: SARM in practice and application of tools, intake process & a snapshot from onset, the Danger Assessment tool (DA tool) and the Women's Experience of Battering Assessment (WEB) tool – within the first 24hours
- Course 4: SARM in practice on the first 72 hours of a shelter stay and departure → Comprehensive Safety Assessment + Personalized Risk Management Plan (PRMP), Social Risks Wheel and Scenario-based learning on importance of an evolving PRMP, Revisiting Emergency Escape Plan & Fast Form in cases of returning to abusive person.
- Course 5: Addressing safety assessment and risk management with children and youth.
- Course 6: Basic principles of SARM's approach, including collaboration, communication, and documentation.
