We promote, champion, and elevate the good work being done by Indigenous Entrepreneurs by extending market reach and strengthening supply chains.

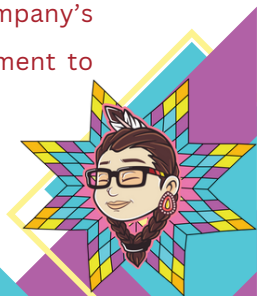

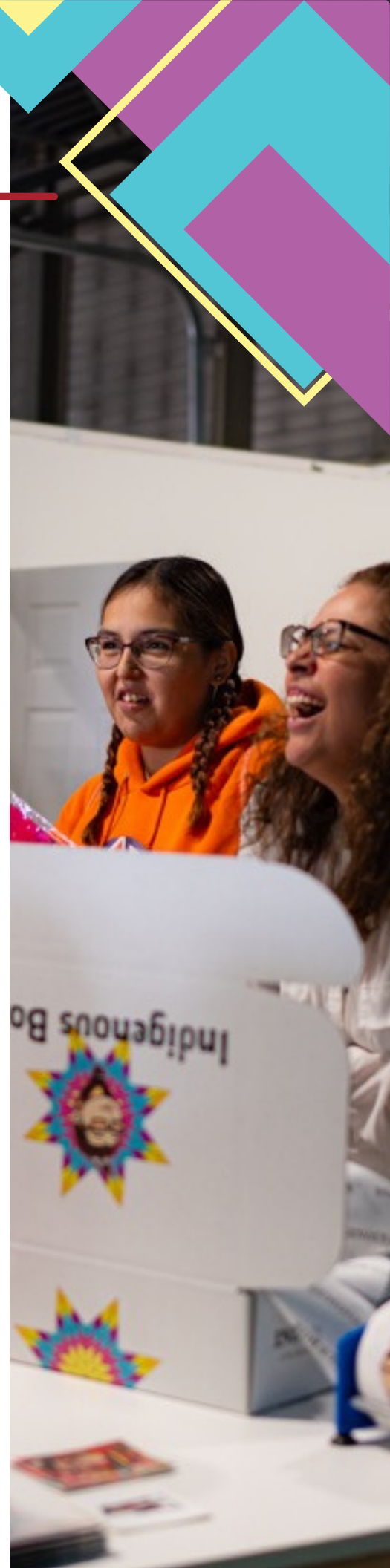
